## Tulsa Conference—Two Weeks!

This year the 37th annual Central States VHF Society conference will be held in Tulsa, Oklahoma on July 24, through July 27 2003. Activities actually are on Friday and Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. You'll want to travel on Thursday and Sunday.

Although the pre-registration period has now passed, there is no penalty for walk-in registrations. You are encouraged to come! Any and all walk-ins are welcome and family program events are still available till the Bus is full at 53 participants per event. Go to the website at <u>http://members.cox.net/csvhfs/</u>, download the registration form so that you know what fees to anticipate. Just bring the form with you.

The time for special guaranteed hotel rates for the conference have passed—but that shouldn't stop you from contacting the hotel and seeing what you can work out. Be sure to mention Central States VHF Society.

The conference will be held at the Renaissance Tulsa Hotel and Convention Center. The Renaissance is brand new just having been opened in early 2003. It is conveniently located on Tulsa East side, about a 10 minute drive from Tulsa International airport. This area is one of the areas in which Tulsa has experienced fantastic growth. The hotel sits right in one of Tulsa's major shopping and entertainment areas. There is a widely diversified selection of eating establishments available close to the hotel, as well. I'm also going to make an excel spreadsheet available for download that was initiated by KØAWU. It's a handy multi-band document that works well for him and it might be helpful for you. If you have any other suggestions—run them by me.

In general, participation is slowly increasing across the country. But participation in Minnesota, whose NLRS club is using the program as a local event, far swamps the rest of the nation. Get your locals on the quest for states and start collecting states again because it's a new program year (2003-2004) as of July 1<sup>st</sup>. #### VHF FM Sprint Contest Feb 9<sup>th</sup> By KB9Q

The Milwaukee Radio Amateurs' Club sponsored an FM sprint back on February 9, 2003, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM local time. Goals were to spur activity, spur regional club competition, and to provide a taste of vhf contesting to new technicians. operation and encourage them to think beyond the rubber duck. Each of four bands above 50 MHz were scheduled for 30 minute segments starting with 2 meters, then 70 centimeters, 6 meters and 1.25 meters. We felt that this order and format would concentrate activity and would let those with out equipment for the less popular FM bands get in and get out!

All the rules, including frequencies, were available at The MRAC website <u>http://www.qsl.net/mrac/index.html</u>.

Over 35 different local call signs are listed in the logs. There were 18 logs and 16 entries received. The goal of getting the Technicians to learn the basics of contesting did not materialize. The entries and call signs heard were almost all from experienced

operators. I think local clubs might have a useful project helping newbies to operate simplex.

We did not get any entries from other areas. However, we did not promote in the national mags but, because it was run on local time, anyone anywhere could compete. I think national promotion would be indicated the next time. We do plan on doing it again on "The Second Sunday of the Second Month at Two O'clock." (2-2-2) My original thought was to do it sometime between the Superbowl and the Stanley Cup Playoffs. Carrying the thought forward I have suggested that we also have a strictly local event on the Green Bay Packer Bye Week Sunday.

I think the format of having each band activated for 30 minutes worked well. I think a change in the scoring values is indicated but those items are more of a fine tuning thing. Finally I think it would be necessary to promote it more aggressively to clubs. I plan on buying a "winning club plaque" and parading it around local radio club meetings. We already have permission to permanently display it at Amateur Electronics Supply here in Milwaukee.
